NORFOLK ISLAND DISCOVERY



16 March to 25 March 2022 Personally Escorted by Jacquey Turner

Norfolk Island is an island in the South Pacific Ocean and an Australian territory for historical reasons even though it is much closer to New Zealand. In 1856 it was settled by former inhabitants of the second largest of the Pitcairn Islands. The Pitcairners were the descendants of the infamous English sailors of mutiny on the Bounty fame and the Tahitian women who, under their leader Fletcher Christian began a new life on isolated Pitcairn Island. Approximately one third of the permanent residents of Norfolk Island are descendants of Pitcairn Islanders, with the remainder split between people originating from Australia and New Zealand. The permanent population of the island is about 1500 people.



WEDNESDAY 16 MARCH

We depart Warragul in the afternoon and drive to our overnight hotel, PARK ROYAL MELBOURNE HOTEL. Dinner tonight will be included.

THURSDAY 17 MARCH

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We will have a very early transfer to the airport for our Qantas flight to Brisbane where we will connect for our Qantas flight to Norfolk Island.

On arrival at Norfolk Island, we shall be met and transferred to the SOUTH PACIFIC RESORT HOTEL, our home for the next 8 nights. This hotel is set in 5 acres of beautifully landscaped gardens and is the most conveniently located hotel on Norfolk Island. On arrival, refreshments will be ready for us and we will each receive a **Museum Pass**, for use in your free time. The pass includes multiple entries to all 5 museums at any time during your stay and 2 guided Tag-A-Long tours.

Later we get together for an **Island Fish Fry**, a feast of local dishes, salads and homemade coconut bread, alongside mouth-watering fried fish. The feast overlooks breathtaking coastal scenery as the sun sets - with live music in the background. All served with local entertainment from the *Baunti Byuutis* dancing group.





FRIDAY 18 MARCH

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We will visit the incredible experience of the **Fletcher's Mutiny Cyclorama**...the stunning and realistic 360° artwork which brings to life the history of the Norfolk Island people and their connection with the infamous mutiny on the 'Bounty'. We will discover how the world's most famous mutiny created the Pitcairn and Norfolk communities.

After our lunch at the Hilli's Restaurant, we will enjoy a **Half Day Island Tour**, introducing us to the island's history and life as it is today. From the historic Kingston to famous convict buildings and beautiful beaches, the tour offers plenty of opportunities for you to take some photos and be fully informed about this fascinating island. We shall also visit Cascade, Longridge and much more.

There will be some free time before we have the opportunity to experience the local hospitality by joining a **Progressive Dinner** when we will enjoy a 3-course meal progressing to different Norfolk Island family homes. During dinner we will hear many Norfolk stories by our guests.



SATURDAY 19 MARCH

There will be an opportunity this morning for a **BBQ Breakfast Bush Walk**. Take your choice of a stroll through Hundred Acres Reserve or for the more energetic, a leisurely 3.5km walk through scenic Mt Bates to Captain Cook Monument. At the end of the walks, we meet on the cliff top at Anson Bay for a delicious breakfast barbeque.

The rest of the day is at leisure before we meet for 3 course dinner at the Bounty Bar & Grill. Later we head out to see the **Sound & Light Show** amongst the convict ruins where we will watch re-enactments of how convicts were treated in days gone.

Nightfall at Kingston brings a different mood to the convict settlement. With the dramatic use of real-life sounds, theatrical lighting and costumed actors, we learn about the shocking decades of Norfolk Island's convict era



SUNDAY 20 MARCH

This morning is free to check out the markets which cater to visitors and locals with supplies of seasonal fresh fruit and vegetables, cut flowers, home cooking, craft and souvenir items, books, jewellery, stamps, post cards and so much more! There is live entertainment and the coffee van selling locally grown coffee. The Sunday markets operate rain, hail or shine! There is sure to be something for you to take home as a memento of this delightful trip

In the early afternoon we join up for our **Convict Settlement Tour** of the World-Heritage-Listed Georgian settlement of **Kingston**. This whole area is a living showcase of Polynesian, convict and Pitcairn Islander history. We take you through the cemetery, where you will hear the history of the colonial headstones, as well as the old houses along Quality Row. You will also walk through the ruins of the New Gaol, see the Pier Store, Boat Shed and the Crank Mill - all of which has to be seen to be believed.

Tonight, we relax with a 3 course dinner at Hilli Restaurant.

MONDAY 21 MARCH

Our **Green Fingers Tour** this morning will feature some of the island's loveliest gardens. Through the morning, we visit a nursery owned and operated by a young Norfolk Islander, and view the hydroponics. We also visit a gorgeous private garden with a spectacular view and then enjoy morning tea at a scenic spot.

Slow food is more than a movement on Norfolk Island, it's a way of life – and visitors reap the benefits. With ninety-nine percent of fresh food grown in the island's rich volcanic soil, a bounty of fresh seafood waiting just offshore and a long list of locally-made meats, cheese, coffee and honey, every meal is a simple but delicious occasion. To enjoy some of this delightful food we will have lunch at the very popular **Olive Café**.

Tonight, we shall dine at Bailey's Restaurant, a beautifully restored house which is the centrepiece of **Governor's Lodge**.

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TUESDAY 22 MARCH

For our **Christians 4WD Tour** we will split up and be part of either the 9am tour and 1pm tour. We will join John and his Island staff - all direct descendants of the Bounty Mutineers, on an exciting 3-hour tour to points of Norfolk, accessible only by 4WD. This back of beyond tour will take us through private properties and the national park featuring spectacular scenery, native flora & bird life. Included are delicious homemade cakes with tea & coffee at a beautiful Island home. All vehicles are comfortable modern 4WDs.

Tonight, we get together for a fun **Night as a Convict** when we will dress up as convicts in outfits supplied and join in with the Commandant for an evening of gaiety, feasting, singing and dancing. All you need to do is bring your sense of humour and prepare yourself for a delicious meal.

WEDNESDAY 23 MARCH

This morning, we visit the home of **Colleen McCullough**, world-renowned author of 24 books, who called Norfolk Island home for almost 36 years. She and husband, Norfolk Islander, Ric Robinson, created a luxurious hideaway and maintained their privacy to ensure that Colleen had the perfect environment for her writing. Some of her most powerful titles were created in this much-loved sanctuary. Her beloved property "Out Yenna" is now open and we shall be escorted through her magnificent home and to view Ric and Colleen's priceless collection of artefacts gathered on their travels all over the world.

We take a trip in the old 1928 A Model Ford - Norfolk's first tour bus-for our **Pitcairn Settlers Village Tour**. We visit the gracious original old Bailey homestead and gardens, stroll through the barn, dairy and out buildings, visit a blacksmith's forge, a WWII Army hut and Museum of Memorabilia.

Tonight, we get together for **Fletcher's Fate Mystery Dinner**, a fascinating evening of interactive theatre, intrigue and mystery. This entertaining play, examining the possible last movements and final whereabouts of the famous mutineer, Fletcher Christian, is dramatically acted out by a 6-character cast over a sumptuous 3 course dinner.



THURSDAY 24 MARCH

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There will be some free time this morning before our visit to **Mootineer Cheeses**, a boutique cheesery founded by John Christian. Milking a small herd of organic cows on pristine Norfolk Island they produce a range of tasty and tempting cheeses.

We visit the local sawmill, view some handmade ukuleles and find out about the local honey and finish off with some cheese and wine tasting and sample the range of delicious locally produced organic Feta, Tasty Houlimi and yummy Cheddar along with complimentary wines.

Tonight, we will enjoy dinner at **The Homestead Restaurant** where they pair local ingredients with the elemental technique of cooking over fire to enhance the contemporary dining experience. The 100 Acre Farm is a working farm that produces beef and vegetables commercially, embracing the farm to plate philosophy as well as sourcing line caught fish from Norfolk's clean wild waters.

FRIDAY 25 MARCH

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The morning is at leisure however the hotel will provide a morning tea before we depart Norfolk Island for an early afternoon Qantas flight back to Melbourne via Sydney. On arrival in Melbourne Airport at approximately 8pm, we shall be met and transferred by coach back to Warragul.

LATE BOOKINGS
