Portugal has a rich, unique culture, lively cities and beautiful countryside. Highlights feature Medieval castles, cobblestone villages, captivating cities and golden beaches.



Friday 20 October Australia - Lisbon

We depart Gippsland in the afternoon and travel by coach to Melbourne Airport in time for our flight to Lisbon, Portugal.

Saturday 21, Sunday 22, Monday 23 October

Lisbon, Portugal

<u>(BBBLDD)</u>

On our arrival in Lisbon, we will be met and transferred to our hotel, the SOFITEL LIBERDADE, or similar, for the next 3 nights. During our time in Lisbon we visit the Belém district and the magnificent **Jerónimos Monastery**, an extraordinary example of Portugal's 'Manueline' style of architecture. We shall take a cable car ride through the narrow streets and visit the **National Tile Museum**. Today you will have your first opportunity to taste the National Portugal Custard Tart.

We shall lunch at a beachside restaurant in Cascais and also visit the charming town of Sintra, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and former summer residence of Portuguese kings and aristocrats and see the **National Palace of Sintra**, a former royal residence characterised by a variety of architectural styles

Tuesday 24, Wednesday 25, Thursday 26 October

(BBBLLD)

Depart Lisbon this morning and drive towards the border. After an included lunch stop we arrive in Seville and will check into the HOTEL ALFONSO XIII, or similar, for a 3-night stay.

Seville, Spain

Seville is one of Spain's most fascinating and exciting cities. Over the next couple of days, we will take a walking tour and visit the 15th century cathedral, one of the most breathtaking, and see **La Giralda**, Seville's most famous monument. The massive cathedral is the burial place of Christopher Columbus.

We visit the **Alcazar**, a magnificent 14th century Mudejar palace that is one of the oldest royal residences in Europe still in use, and enjoy a walk through the Barrio de Santa Cruz, a maze of narrow streets, whitewashed houses and small squares.





The best way to appreciate the city is by a horse drawn carriage ride through the streets. No visit to Seville is complete without attending a performance of the region's famous Flamenco and one evening you'll see an authentic **Flamenco Show**.

We shall also visit the haunting **Casa de Pilatos**, which is still occupied by the ducal Medinaceli family, and is one of the city's most glorious mansions. It's a mixture of Mudéjar, Gothic and Renaissance styles, with some beautiful tilework and artesonados (ceilings of interlaced beams with decorative insertions).

Friday 27, Saturday 28 October Ronda - Granada

After breakfast we shall drive past the olive groves and the gleaming white villages. We stop at Ronda and visit the **Bull Fighting Museum** then continue on to glorious Granada. On arrival, we will check into the NH COLLECTION VICTORIA HOTEL, or similar, for a 2-night stay.

Overlooking the town is one of the most remarkable fortresses ever built, the **Alhambra** and **Nasrid Palaces**. We shall explore these exquisite palaces, a fantasy of stone, and we will walk on to the exotic water gardens of **Generalife**, the royal summer residence.

Sunday 29 OctoberCordoba(B D)We set off early along the Guadalquivir Valley, for the well-preserved Moorish city of Cordoba.On arrival

We set off early along the Guadalquivir Valley, for the well-preserved Moorish city of Cordoba. On arrival we will check into the LAS CASAS DE LA JUDERIA HOTEL, or similar, for an overnight stay.

While in Cordoba we will see the 2000-year-old bridge and the famous Plaza de Porto. Afterwards we shall have a walking tour through the flower-filled streets of the Jewish Quarter and visit the **Mezquita**, built between the 8th and 10th centuries, considered one of the most extraordinary buildings in all of Europe.

Monday 30, Tuesday 31 October, Wednesday 1 November Madrid, Spain

<u>(B B B L D)</u>

This morning we shall transfer to the rail station for our AVE train journey to Madrid. On our arrival in Madrid we shall check into the HOTEL ORFILA, or similar, for the next three nights.

Madrid is a vibrant, sophisticated city which we will explore on a walking tour through the historic centre and the arcaded **17th century Plaza Mayor**. We shall also see the **Puerta del Sol** before visiting the **Palacio Real**, whose rooms are filled with antiques and treasured artworks.

During our time in Madrid, we will have a full day trip travelling south to the fortified city of **Toledo** which dates from Roman times. We shall visit the **6th century cathedral** and the **Church of Santo Tomé** which houses some of El Greco's most important works. Before returning to Madrid, we shall also visit the city's oldest synagogue, the **12th century Santa Maria la Blanca**. Along with a gourmet tapa walking tour and many other highlights we shall visit in Madrid, there will be plenty of free time for shopping and additional sightseeing.

During your free time you may like to visit the Prado Museum, one of Madrid's main attractions where works by Spain's three great masters Goya, Velazquez and El Greco are on show or the Reina Sofia Art Centre which concentrates on 20th century art, its most famous work being Picasso's 'Guernica'.



Thursday 2, Friday 3 November Barcelona

(B B D)

This morning we re-board the AVE train for our journey to Barcelona, Spain's second largest city. We shall transfer to the MAJESTIC HOTEL, or similar, for a 2-night stay.

Our time in Barcelona will be spent exploring many attractions including a guided introduction to Gaudi's architectural masterpieces including a night visit to **Casa Mila**, one of Barcelona's best-known Art Nouveau buildings, considered architecturally innovative for its steel structure and curtain walls. Next is the impressive, but as yet unfinished, **Sagrada Familia Basilica** and **Parc Güell**, a beautiful municipal garden with a superb panoramic view over the city.

We shall also explore the heart of the old city – the **medieval Gothic Quarter**. The narrow, labyrinthine streets and quiet squares are quite distinct from the rest of the city. We shall see the magnificent 13th century cathedral, notable for its fine Gothic chapels, medieval choir stalls and shady cloister.



Saturday 4, Sunday 5 November Bilbao - San Sebastian

(BBLD)

This morning we shall transfer to the Barcelona El Prat Airport for our short flight to Bilbao where we will visit the **Guggenheim Museum**. Hailed as the most important structure of its time when it opened in 1997, Frank Gehry's Guggenheim Museum has changed the way people think about museums and continues to challenge assumptions about the connections between art, architecture, and collecting. After lunch we drive to beautiful San Sebastian. On arrival we shall check in to the HOTEL MARIA CHRISTINA, or similar, for a 2-night stay.

San Sebastián is a resort town on the Bay of Biscay in Spain's mountainous Basque Country. It's known

for **Playa de la Concha** and **Playa de Ondarreta**, a very upmarket district known as a millionaires' belt on account of its lavish holiday homes, beaches framed by a picturesque bayfront promenade, and world-renowned restaurants

In its cobblestoned old town (**Parte Vieja**), upscale shops neighbour vibrant bars pairing local wines with bite-size regional specialties.

During our time in San Sebastian, we shall also take a walking tour of the **Old Quarter**. We shall see the numbered balconies of the **Plaza de la Constiticion**, a reminder of the days when bullfights were held in the square.



Monday 6, Tuesday 7 November

Santillana del Mar

We leave San Sebastian and head west along the coast to picturesque Santillana de Mar with a stop at a **Cider House.** After checking into our hotel, PARADORE GILBLAS, or similar, for a 2-night stay, we will have time to stroll the rustic cobblestone streets to the church square.

Santillana del Mar is a historic town situated in Cantabria, Spain. Its many historic buildings attract thousands of holidaymakers every year. There is an old saying that Santillana del Mar is The Town of Three Lies, since it is neither a Saint (Santo), nor flat (Ilana), nor is it by the sea (Mar) as implied by its name. However, the name actually derives from Santa Juliana (or Santa Illana) whose remains are kept in the Colegiata, a Romanesque church and former Benedictine monastery.

Another highlight we shall visit is **The Cave of Altamira**, famous for its Upper Palaeolithic cave paintings featuring drawings and polychrome rock paintings of wild mammals and human hands. When the discovery was first made public in 1880, it led to a bitter public controversy between experts since many did not believe prehistoric man had the intellectual capacity to produce any kind of artistic expression. The acknowledgment of the authenticity of the paintings, which finally came in 1902, changed the perception of prehistoric human beings.



Wednesday 8, Thursday 9 November Castilla y Leon – Villa Franca

(B B D)

This morning we drive south west to the Castilla-Leon region, located in the interior of the northern part of Spain. Its natural heritage includes the **Picos de Europa National Park**, which can be explored by taking the Route of the Cares River. The area of **Las Médulas**, a landscape of open-air mines, has also been awarded the World Heritage designation by the UNESCO.



The province of León is home to places with a rich cultural heritage such as Ponferrada, Astorga with its **Episcopal Palace by Gaudí**; as well as the capital, León, with its Cathedral and the **Casa Botines** building, also designed by Gaudí. We shall also visit the **Knights Templar**.

Our hotel for our 2 nights in Castilla Leon is the PARADOR DE VILLAFRANCO DEL BIERZO, or similar.

Friday 10, Saturday 11 November Santiago de Compostela

(B B L D)

Santiago de Compostela is the capital of northwest Spain's Galicia region. It's known as the culmination of the Camino de Santiago pilgrimage route, now considered by UNESCO a World Heritage Site, and the alleged burial site of the Apostle St. James ("Santiago"). His remains lie within the Cathedral de Santiago de Compostela, consecrated in 1211, whose elaborately carved stone facades open onto grand plazas within the medieval walls of the old town. During our time we will have a walking tour of the old town, visit the **Cathedral** and end with drinks and tapas. We will enjoy our last Spanish lunch at a local home.

Santiago is certainly one of Spain's most monumental towns, with a particular architecture style all of its own. But it is also a town full of life, with one of the most famous Universities and a large number of students who guarantee youthful ambience in between the historical walls. Also, the region's cuisine is of great reputation, and it is said that nowhere you can eat better seafood than in Galicia.

While in Santiago we will stay at the PARADORES DE SANTIAGO, or similar, for two nights.



Sunday 12 November

Porto, Portugal

(B L)

After breakfast we will drive south and visit the ancient capital town of **Guimarães.** After a lovely lunch we have a scenic drive through the Douro Valley to Porto, Portugal. On arrival, we shall farewell our fellow travellers that are continuing on with the optional 7-night cruise and check into LE MONUMENTAL HOTEL, or similar, for a two night stay.

Monday 13 NovemberPorto Sightseeing(B FD)We will spend the morning on a walking tour with a local guide. There's much more to Portugal's second
city than its eponymous fortified wine—historic architecture, cutting-edge design, fabulous food and
wine, and a hip, laid-back vibe. We shall have some free time this afternoon to relax, or explore the city
further for those last-minute souvenirs. Tonight, we shall get together for our Farewell Dinner.

Gippsland Travel may receive fees, commissions, gifts or financial incentives from third party supplier/s under this contract.

COVID POLICY

If the tour cannot operate due to COVID-19 state border closures and restrictions, the tour will be rescheduled and any funds paid will be transferred to the new tour date.

Gippsland Travel recommends yo are fully vaccinated prior to travel.

LATE BOOKINGS

Higher deposit payments are required for late bookings. A guarantee of full payment is required at the time of booking for all bookings received within 4 weeks of departure.

GOVERNING LAW

PASSPORT and VISA



Designed specifically to navigate the narrow Douro river in Portugal, the **S.S. Sao Gabriel** brings the best of the region to life with public rooms, decor and cuisine all designed to highlight this famous epicentre of port wine production.

Carrying 100 passengers in 50 cabins, all of which offer river views, **S.S. Sao Gabriel** offers cruisers plenty of niceties, like an onboard swimming pool, a small spa and fitness centre, and a small gift shop.

A panoramic lounge situated all the way forward offers 180-degree views of the Douro River Valley, and like all Uniworld vessels, all beverages onboard are offered on a complimentary basis.

S.S. Sao Gabriel Dining

Meals are taken in the ship's main restaurant on Cape Verde Deck, which features open seating and cuisine inspired by Portuguese favourites alongside international and North American dishes.

Breakfast and lunch are typically served over several hours, while dinners tend to start at a set time, usually around 7p.m.

Lighter fare and afternoon snacks can be found in the ship's lounge on Azores Deck, which also houses a full-service bar offering specialty coffees, and alcoholic and non-alcoholic beverages throughout the day.

In a first for Uniworld's Douro river cruises, passengers booking suites aboard **S.S. Sao Gabriel** will be entitled to the same butler service found aboard Uniworld's other European-based river cruise vessels.

While Uniworld has not announced specific cabin details, features like hand-crafted Savoir of England beds, Egyptian linens, L'Occitane toiletries (or Hermes at the suite level) and interactive flat-panel television entertainment systems with complimentary movies and television shows are pretty much standard issue across the fleet.

S.S. Sao Gabriel's Sun Deck features an outdoor swimming pool that is perfect for cooling off in the heat of the Douro, which can get hot, particularly during the summer months. Other niceties include plenty of shaded seating, and unshaded options for those looking to work on their tan.

In addition to daily briefings, cooking classes, demonstrations and the odd guest lecture make up the majority of the entertainment onboard. **S.S. Sao Gabriel** sails a port-intensive itinerary through the Douro River Valley, so expect to be off the ship for much of the day.

At night, a piano player entertains in the ship's main lounge, while passengers mingle over cocktails. Between the heat and the copious amounts of port wine to be enjoyed while on-tour, many cruisers elect to retire to their cabins shortly after dinner.
