Saturday 2nd September

MELBOURNE - SEATTLE

(WD)

We shall have a morning departure from Gippsland to Melbourne for our flight to Seattle. On arrival, we shall be met and transferred to the KIMPTON MONACO HOTEL, or similar, for the next four nights.

Saturday 2nd – Tuesday 5th September

SEATTLE, Washington

(BBBBD)

Seattle is nicknamed The Emerald City. The city is a damp green gem, with an abundance of evergreen trees throughout, and spectacular views of the Cascade mountains to the east and the Olympic mountains to the west. The cultural and business centre of the Pacific Northwest, the city and its surrounding areas are the home to many major corporations such as Boeing, Microsoft, Amazon, Costco, Nintendo of America, Starbucks plus the University of Washington, as well as a vibrant arts and music scene and an excellent park system.

During our time in Seattle, we shall explore far and wide, visiting many highlights such as Pikes Market, and the Space Needle to experience a fantastic view of Seattle. Highlights will be Boeing Backstage Pass, a harbour cruise and Beneath The Streets Underground History Tour.

Along with our Seattle City Tour, we will spend time on day trips to Olympic National Park, encompassing nearly a million acres, the park protects a vast wilderness, thousands of years of human history and to Mt. Rainier, the most glaciated peak in the contiguous U.S.A., spawning five major rivers.

CANNON BEACH, Oregon

We depart Seattle after breakfast and cross the Columbia River and spend some time in the small town of Astoria. We shall see some spectacular views of the Columbia River while we enjoy a tour on the Astoria Riverfront Trolley before some free time for lunch.

In the afternoon we head to Cannon Beach, a famous, quaint small town with beautiful art galleries, boutiques and bookshops to explore. It is commonly recognized as one of the best beaches in Oregon and is most famous for towering Haystack Rock, a seasonal haven for tufted puffins and Hug Point waterfall has sea caves.

Thursday 7th – Friday 8th September

PORTLAND, Oregon

(BBD)

Today we leave the coast and head to Portland, "the City of Roses", the largest city in Oregon and the second largest city in the Pacific Northwest after Seattle. On our first night we shall enjoy a dinner cruise. There is plenty to see during our time in Portland; International Rose Test Garden, Pittock Mansion, Pioneer Courthouse Square, Forest Park, Washington Park, Pearl District, Multnomah Falls, Distillery Row and Portland Aerial Tram to name a few.

Mount Hood's volcanic peak is an icon of Oregon and one of the most breathtaking sights in all the West. Our day tour takes us round, and under the mountain, showing all the breathtaking sights the region has to offer. We shall visit the Ski Lift area and take a cable car ride to the mountain peak.

Saturday 9th – Sunday 10th September

FLORENCE, Oregon

(BBD)

We head down the Oregon Coast to Florence with a stop along the way in Newport, where you can take photos of the spectacular Yaquina Bay Bridge.

Florence is a small city at the mouth of the Siuslaw River, on the Oregon coast. Its vast Sea Lion Caves are home to Steller sea lions. Nearby, trails around the restored 19th-century Heceta Head Lighthouse offer views of seabirds and migrating whales and hopefully we can see a little closer on our Whale Watching Cruise.

Shops and galleries fill the city's Historic Old Town district. Across the river are the towering sand mounds of the Oregon Dunes National Recreation Area.

Monday 11th – Tuesday 12th September

KLAMATH FALLS, Oregon

(BBD)

We drive south along the coast before heading inland to Klamath Falls. The city itself is in the large Klamath Basin. At the northern end of the city is gorgeous Klamath Lake. The views in Klamath are spectacular, if you look to the south, you can see snow covered Mt. Shasta. The outlying areas of the city are almost completely filled with acres upon acres of farm land.

We shall have a full day trip exploring the marvellous sights of the Crater Lake National Park in the Cascade Mountains of southern Oregon. It's known for its namesake Crater Lake, formed by the now-collapsed volcano, Mount Mazama.

Wednesday 13th – Thursday 14th September SHASTA LAKE, California

(BBD)

We cross the border from beautiful Oregon to Shasta Lake in the state of California. Shasta Lake is one of the dominant features in Northern California.

We will be able to see the lake from Antlers Bridge and the Pit River Bridge. We shall explore inside the Shasta Lake Caverns and cruise the dam.

Soaring to 14,179 feet high, Mt. Shasta acts as a totem from almost anywhere in the northern part of the state. And while some mountains climb gradually, this one rises from surrounding flatlands with such towering, snow-capped majesty that it seems almost unreal.

We shall venture to the Lassen Volcanic National Park on a full day tour. It's rich in hydrothermal sites like Bumpass Hell, with its acres of bubbling mud pots. The summit of Lassen Peak Volcano offers views over the surrounding wilderness. Nearby, the Devastated Area is littered with lava rocks from its last eruption. We also visit the historic Loomis Museum and Visitor Centre.

This morning we head west to the California coast through Arcata to the Redwood National Park. Most people know Redwood as home to the tallest trees on Earth. But the Parks also protect vast prairies, oak woodlands, wild rivers, and 40 miles of rugged coastline.

There will be time for a picnic lunch and a visit to the Kuchel Visitor Centre.





There will be time to walk along the Lady Bird Johnson Grove and Tall Tree Grove before we head south to overnight in Arcata where we can visit The Arcata Marsh & Wildlife Sanctuary which offers quiet trails and superb birdwatching.

LAKE TAHOE, Nevada

On our drive to Lake Tahoe, we shall stop in Sacramento, the capital of California, for a city tour.

We continue on to Lake Tahoe, a large freshwater lake in the Sierra Nevada Mountains, straddling the border of California and Nevada. It's known for its beaches and ski resorts.

On the southwest shore, Emerald Bay State Park contains the 1929 Nordic-style mansion Vikingsholm. Along the lake's northeast side, Lake Tahoe Nevada State Park includes Sand Harbor Beach and Spooner Lake, a gateway to the long-distance Tahoe Rim Trail.



We shall also experience one of the greatest views of Lake Tahoe with a Scenic Gondola Ride.

A separate contract with the supplier/s will apply and will be governed by the supplier's Terms and Conditions. Gippsland Travel cannot guarantee the performance of any third-party supplier/s. Gippsland Travel may receive fees, commissions, gifts or financial incentives from third party supplier/s under this contract.

COVID POLICY

If the tour cannot operate due to COVID-19 border closures and restrictions, the tour will be rescheduled and any funds paid will be transferred to the new tour date.

Gippsland Travel advises you will need to show proof of being fully vaccinated against COVID-19.

You are considered fully vaccinated for air travel to the United States if travel is:

2 weeks (14 days) after your dose of an accepted single-dose vaccine

2 weeks (14 days) after your second dose of an accepted 2-dose series

LATE BOOKINGS

- Carry your own hand luggage / handle your own suitcase when porterage is not supplied eg. at airports.
- Get on and off various modes of transport without assistance, including small boats. Assistance will be
 offered where necessary.

At our discretion we can exclude you from a tour or any activity if we consider that you are unable to safely participate in that tour or activity or we consider your participation may place the safety of other guests at risk. This information will remain confidential and can be supplied in a sealed envelope.

ITINERARY CHANGES and ITINERARY VARIATIONS

FORCE MAJEURE:

Force Majeure means the occurrence of an event that is beyond Gippsland Travel's reasonable control and which could not have been reasonably prevented by Gippsland Travel. Force majeure includes, but is not limited to: acts of God, accident, riots, war, terrorist act, epidemic, pandemic, quarantine, outbreaks of infectious disease or any other public health crisis, civil commotion, breakdown of communication facilities, natural catastrophes and natural disasters (including but not limited to flooding, fire, earthquake, landslide), adverse weather conditions, high or low water levels; government directed travel restrictions or omissions, changes in laws or regulations, national strikes, explosion, generalised lack of availability of raw materials or energy, nuclear or other industrial accident causing environmental pollution or

contamination; change in law, meaning, enactment, amendment (including repeal) in the law or administration of any law in Australia or any jurisdiction or territory relevant to the booking contract, which includes changes in statute, regulation, determination, by-law, declaration, licence and the common law as applicable from time to time.

For the avoidance of doubt, Force Majeure shall not include (a) financial distress nor inability of either party to make a profit or avoid a financial loss, (b) changes in market prices or conditions, or (c) a party's financial inability to perform its obligations hereunder.

In the event that a Force Majeure is declared, the customer will be bound by the third-party supplier/s Terms and Conditions, if applicable.

TERMINATION OF BOOKING CONTRACT OR CHANGE OF TRAVEL ARRANGEMENTS DUE TO FORCE MAJEURE

If Gippsland Travel, in its reasonable opinion, considers that any Force Majeure event prevents Gippsland Travel (whether directly or through its employees, contractors, subcontractors and agents) from lawfully or safely providing any products or services subject of the booking contract with you, Gippsland Travel may immediately by written notice; (a) terminate the booking contract (in whole or part of); or (b) change your travel arrangements as reasonably practicable to ensure your safety and invoice for any additional costs.

If you are eligible for a refund once a booking has been cancelled, the balance less any non-refundable amounts will be forwarded to you once received by Gippsland Travel from the third-party supplier/s.
