

Friday 31 May Melbourne (D)

We depart Warragul in the afternoon and drive to the PARK ROYAL MELBOURNE HOTEL for an overnight stay. Dinner tonight will be included.

Saturday 1 June Arrive Broome

After breakfast we transfer to Melbourne Airport for our flight to Broome. On arrival in Broome, we will be met and transferred to our hotel. The rest of the day is yours to enjoy at leisure. This evening, we get together for a relaxed dinner.

Sunday 2 JuneGibb River Road, Windjana Gorge, Tunnel Creek(B L D)

We leave Broome this morning and head to the **Boab Prison Tree**, believed to be 1,500 years old. We continue along the Gibb River Road to **Windjana Gorge**, where ancient marine fossils lay embedded in the gorge walls. Next, it's on to **Tunnel Creek**, Western Australia's oldest cave system. Here we have a chance to wade through the cool waters that fill the tunnel and emerge on the other side to discover a serene oasis. On arrival at **Fitzroy Crossing**, we check into our hotel, then meet for dinner.

Accommodation: Fitzroy Crossing - FITZROY RIVER LODGE for an overnight stay.

Monday 3 JuneGeikie Gorge, Halls Creek, Purnululu National Park(B L D)Today we travel to Danggu Geikie Gorge National Park and explore incredible Geikie Gorge, famed for its
towering walls that have been bleached white by the river when it floods. Afterwards, we head to Halls Creek,
before arriving at Purnululu National Park. There will be time to settle into your lodge before an open-air dinner
tonight.

Accommodation: BUNGLE BUNGLE WILDERNESS LODGE for two nights.

Tuesday 4 June

Purnululu National Park, Piccaninny Creek, Cathedral Gorge

(B L D)

We have a full day set aside to explore **Purnululu National Park**, starting with a walk along **Piccaninny Creek**. This winding gorge is set deep within the **Bungle Bungle Range**, offering unparalleled views of the beehive domes. Next stop is **Cathedral Gorge**, a natural red rock Amphitheatre created by millions of years of water erosion. This spacious cavern is renowned for its acoustics, and you will see why as you wander through it.

End the day of discovery by watching the sunset over the Bungle Bungle Range – with a glass of bubbly in hand, of course.

Accommodation: BUNGLE BUNGLE WILDERNESS LODGE



Wednesday 5 JunePurnululu National Park, Echidna Chasm, Kununurra(B L D)We set out on a hike to Echidna Chasm, a natural cleft in the rock that reaches a staggering 200 metres in
height while only being one metre wide at certain points. Later we travel along the Spring Creek Track to
Kununurra.

Accommodation: KUNUNURRA COUNTRY CLUB RESORT for two nights

Thursday 6 JuneLake Argyle, Ord River, Kununurra(B L D)After breakfast, we travel to Lake Argyle and join a wildlife cruise on the mighty Ord River. From a modern
shaded vessel, we discover the area's ecological system that has developed from the damming of the Ord River
at two locations. Later we enjoy sunset while cruising on Lake Kununurra. Keep an eye out for wildlife and
soak up the views as our boat makes its way through winding creeks and picturesque lagoons.

Accommodation: KUNUNURRA COUNTRY CLUB RESORT



Parry's Lagoon, Wyndham, El Questro

We visit **Parry's Lagoon** this morning, home to an array of birdlife. Next it's on to **Wyndham**, where you'll soak up the views of the Cambridge Gulf from the Five Rivers Lookout. After lunch we can admire the imposing **Cockburn Ranges** as we journey to Emma Gorge for the evening.

Accommodation: EMMA GORGE RESORT for an overnight stay

Saturday 8 June El Questro, Home Valley Station

(B L D)

Today we walk to **Emma Gorge** for a swim beneath a towering droplet waterfall. Next, we visit **Zebedee Springs**, a permanent natural thermal spring tucked away in a secluded pocket of rainforest. Here there will be an opportunity to relax as you soak in the hot springs and leave feeling refreshed. We continue to the iconic **Home Valley Station**, crossing the **Pentecost River** along the way. Nestled amid the sweeping **Cockburn Range**, it's not hard to see why this immense cattle property was used as the setting for Baz Luhrmann's blockbuster film, 'Australia'.

Tonight, we head to a spectacular viewpoint just in time for sunset and will soak up the breathtaking views with a glass of bubbly and watch as the ever-changing colours dance over the Cockburn Range.

Sunday 9 June

Gibb River Road, Mitchell Plateau

This morning, we leave El Questro and head back on the Gibb River Road and ford the mighty **Durack River**. We then turn off and travel north on the **Kalumburu Road** towards the isolated **Mitchell Plateau**. Along the way, we stop at **Drysdale River Station** for lunch. Afterwards, we enter a remote world of Livistona palm forests, beautiful lookouts, magnificent waterfalls and isolated swimming holes. Accommodation: MITCHELL FALLS WILDERNESS LODGE for two nights.

Monday 10 June

Mitchell Falls

Today we have a full day to discover the beauty of **Mitchell Falls**, with its tiered waterfalls and Indigenous rock art. When available, local Indigenous guides will join the adventure. We begin with a guided hike to **Little Mertens Falls** to view rarely seen rock art, then continue to **Big Mertens Falls** before arriving at the incredible Mitchell Falls.

Here you can go for a swim in the pools above the falls then take an **included** helicopter flight over Mitchell Falls and the surrounding wilderness back to your 4WD vehicle (or if you prefer, hike back with your guide).




Tuesday 11 June Mitchell Plateau, King Edward River

(BLD)

Today we continue with our journey and along the way to Drysdale River Station we will visit **Wandjina** and **Gwion Gwion** (Bradshaw) rock art galleries. The earliest visible Kimberley rock art paintings are known as 'Naturalistic', followed by the Gwion motifs, formerly known as 'Bradshaws'. Another style is the schematized human forms of the 'Static Polychrome', as well as the Painted Hand motifs. The Wanjina paintings depict the spirit ancestors and their representation in anthropomorphic form, forming a continuous Aboriginal tradition dating to the last 4000 years.

After a swim in the clear waters at **King Edward River** we continue and cross the **Drysdale River** and arrive at Drysdale River Station.

Accommodation: DRYSDALE RIVER STATION for an overnight stay.



Wednesday 12 June

Manning Creek, Galvans Gorge, Gibb River Road

(BLD)

Further along the Gibb River Road we stop at **Manning Creek** for lunch in the shade of boab trees. Keep an eye out for the region's bird life and enjoy a refreshing swim in the pristine water under paperbarks. We continue to **Galvans Gorge**, one of the prettiest short walks in the Kimberley. A multi-tiered waterfall plunges down a rocky gorge wall into a pretty, reflective pool surround by luxuriant vegetation. It is a delightfully pretty spot to relax and ponder nature.

Accommodation: BELL GORGE WILDERNESS LODGE for two nights.

Thursday 13 June

Bell Gorge

Today we travel to **Bell Gorge**, the most famous gorge along the Gibb River Road. Bell Gorge is part of the Wunaamin (King Leopold Range) Conservation Park. Here there are spectacular cliffs surrounded by a series of tiered waterholes. You may like to take the opportunity to hike to the lower pool of the gorge and enjoy a relaxing dip below the cascading waterfall.

Accommodation: BELL GORGE WILDERNESS LODGE



Friday 14 JuneWunaamin Miliwundi Ranges, Derby, Broome(B L D)Back on the Gibb River Road, we travel through the Wunaamin Conservation Park to Derby, where we will visit
the Mowanjum Art and Culture Centre, a creative hub for the Worrorra, Ngarinyin and Wunumbal tribes, who
make up the Mowanjum community outside Derby.

In the gallery space, we shall see artworks from established and emerging artists from the Worrorra, Ngarinyin and Wunumbal tribes, including Donny Woolagoodja, Sandra Mungulu and Cecilia Umbagai. We return to the Cable Beach Club Resort and later this evening we shall enjoy a drink before dinner at the resort.

Accommodation: Broome, CABLE BEACH CLUB RESORT AND SPA for an overnight stay

Saturday 15 JuneBroome(B D)Today is a day of leisure to soak up the atmosphere of Broome. There are many activities available in Broome
to further explore the region, or just relax by the pool or walk along the beach. There are plenty of retail and
souvenir shops to help with the retail therapy. We get together tonight for our farewell dinner.

Gippsland Travel may receive fees, commissions, gifts or financial incentives from third party supplier/s under this contract.

LATE BOOKINGS

Higher deposit payments are required for late bookings. A guarantee of full payment is required at the time of booking for all bookings received within 4 weeks of departure.

BOOKINGS SOLD ON A SHARE BASIS

Bookings may be accepted on a share room basis on the proviso that the person requesting the share reservation agrees that while every effort will be made to match suitability of the passengers there is no guarantee that a share room can be provided. If a share room is not available at the time of final payment, either the single room alternative, at an additional cost, or the cancellation conditions detailed in your itinerary will apply.

HEALTH & FITNESS
