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Thursday 12 February

Melbourne – Santiago

(D)

We shall transfer from Gippsland to Melbourne Airport to depart on our flight to Santiago de Chile. On arrival we will be met by our guide and transferred to our hotel, CUMBRES LASTARRIA, or similar, for a 2-night stay. Dinner tonight will be at a local restaurant.

Sprawled across Chile's central valley tucked between high Andean peaks and the coastal cordillera, lies the cosmopolitan city of Santiago de Chile or Santiago for short. It was founded in 1541 and named Santiago del Nuevo Extremo, "Santiago of the New Frontier" by Spanish conqueror Pedro de Valdivia who also became Chile's first royal governor. The shaded Plaza de Armas is the city's heart framed by some of Chile's impressive colonial buildings such as the Metropolitan Cathedral, the Governor's Palace and the Historical Museum. The spectacular Parque Metropolitano is home to the city's zoo and botanical gardens. It is also one of the world's largest city parks.

Friday 13 February

Santiago

(B D)

This morning, we depart the hotel for a walking sightseeing tour of the city of Santiago. The tour combines conversation and walking through the main cultural points of the city in a unique experience.

We will hear interesting stories about Chilean culture and explore downtown Santiago with stops at the Fine Arts Museum, Cerro Santa Lucia, the Central Market, the Plaza de Armas, the Financial District, the Presidential Palace and Paris-London neighbourhood. Dinner tonight will be at a local restaurant.





Saturday 14 February Santiago – Puerto Natales – Torres del Paine National Park (B D)

We depart Santiago this morning and fly to Puerto Natales. On arrival we will be transferred to the Torres del Paine National Park, where we will stay at the LAGO GREY HOTEL, *or similar*, for the next three nights. Located on Grey Lake, surrounded by a crystalline glacier, granite mountains peaks, forests and rivers, this hotel is the ideal location for a Torres del Paine National Park experience.

After we check in, we will meet a guide from Lago Grey to discuss which excursions you would like to take part in during your stay. A highlight of our stay will be taking a walk in pristine nature right outside of your room.

Sunday 15, Monday 16 February **Torres del Paine National Park** **(B L D) x2**

Torres del Paine National Park is South America's most famous park and a UNESCO World Biosphere Reserve. It is best recognised for its magnificent central massif, sculptured by glaciers into unmistakable cuernos (horns) and torres (towers). Rising from the sea to over 3353 metres, these granite spires are truly impressive. Varied and abundant wildlife including guanacos, elusive pumas, and dozens of bird species roam here, making this Patagonia's top adventure destination.

During our time in Torres del Paine National Park, we will participate in several walking excursions as well as driving tours that will highlight its natural wonders. This beautiful corner of Chilean Patagonia will be unforgettable.

Tuesday 17 February

Torres del Paine National Park - Punta Arenas

(B D)

This morning, we will travel by road to Punta Arenas. On arrival, we will be met by a representative of Aurora Expeditions and transferred to our hotel for an overnight stay.

On the edge of the Magellan Strait on the Brunswick Peninsula lies Punta Arenas. It is the southernmost populous city in Chile and the capital of the region Magallanes and Antarctica Chilena. It was founded in 1848 and was at first a small penal colony to increase sovereignty over the Magellan Straight.

Tonight, we meet our fellow expeditioners at a voyage briefing where we will reconfirm transfer times for tomorrow, explain the procedures for our flight to King George Island and outline important IAATO regulations for visitors to Antarctica.



Wednesday 18 February (EMBARKATION) Punta Arenas – King George Island (B D)

This morning, we will be transferred to Punta Arenas airport for our charter flight to King George Island, Antarctica (weather permitting). The flight will take approximately one hour and forty-five minutes. On arrival into King George Island the expedition team is on hand to greet us and to prepare us for the Zodiac transfer to the vessel. You will have time to settle into your cabin before our important safety briefings.

Note: King George Island is located at the northern part of the Antarctic Peninsula in the South Shetland Islands and is one of the most remote places on Earth. A clear sky with perfect visibility is required for safe take-off and landing.

Thursday 19 to Thursday 26 February

Weddell Sea & Antarctic Peninsula

(B L D) x8

It is almost impossible to describe the feeling of arriving in Antarctica. Spotting your first iceberg and taking a deep breath of some of the most fresh, crisp air on earth is an experience that will stay with you forever.

Once we arrive, the western side of the Antarctic Peninsula and the South Shetland Islands are ours to explore, and we have a host of choices available to us. Because we are so far south, we will experience approximately 18-24 hours of daylight, and the days can be as busy as you wish.

Your experienced expedition team, who have made countless journeys to this area, will use their expertise to design your voyage from day to day, choosing the best options based on the prevailing weather, ice conditions and wildlife opportunities.

We generally make landings or Zodiac excursions twice a day. You will want to rug up before joining Zodiac cruises along spectacular ice cliffs or among grounded icebergs, keeping watch for whales, seals and porpoising penguins. Zodiacs will also transport you from the ship to land, where you can visit penguin rookeries, discover historic huts, and explore some of our favourite spots along the peninsula.



While ashore we aim to stretch our legs, wandering along pebbly beaches or perhaps up snow-covered ridgelines to vantage points with mountains towering overhead and ice-speckled oceans below. If you have chosen an optional activity, you will have the option to do that whenever conditions allow, and of course keen polar plungers will have the chance to fully immerse themselves in polar waters - conditions permitting!

In addition to Zodiac cruises and shore excursions, we may cruise some of the narrow, dramatic straits separating offshore islands from the mainland, or linger in scenic bays to watch whales travelling or feeding. This is a great time to enjoy the observation lounge for uninterrupted views of Antarctica in all its splendour. Keep an ear out for the creak and deep rumble of glaciers as they carve their way from summit to sea. Take a quiet moment to experience the wonder of this incredible white continent.

Central to the story of where Sir Ernest Shackleton's ship, the Endurance, became trapped in formidable sea ice, the Weddell Sea certainly is high on the list for many polar adventurers.

A small group of islands off the eastern tip of the Antarctic Peninsula forms the Antarctic Sound, known as the gateway to the Weddell Sea and famously dubbed “iceberg alley” for the massive icebergs that drift through its waters. Though navigation can be challenging, the rewards are rich—from ancient fossils like ammonites and clams to unforgettable wildlife encounters.

The Weddell Sea is home to large Adélie penguin colonies, as well as volcanic islands where blue-eyed shags and Wilson’s storm petrels compete for nesting space. Whether on a Zodiac cruise or paddling through sea ice by kayak, you may spot chinstrap and gentoo penguins, along with humpback, minke, and orca whales—so keep your camera ready.



Friday 27, Saturday 28 February

Drake Passage Crossing

(B L D) x2

Enjoy a final morning landing in the South Shetland Islands before we enter the Drake Passage for our return journey to South America.

With lectures and film presentations to complete our Antarctic experience, there is still plenty of time to enjoy the magic of the Southern Ocean and the life that calls it home. There is time for reflection and discussion about what we have seen and experienced. We hope you become ambassadors for Antarctica telling your family, friends and colleagues about your journey to this magical place, advocating for its conservation and preservation so that they might one day visit the region to experience what you have been lucky to see and do here.

As we approach the tip of South America, our Captain may sail close to legendary Cape Horn, weather and time permitting.

Sunday 1 March	(DISEMBARKATION)	Ushuaia - Buenos Aires	(B D)
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During the early morning, we cruise up the Beagle Channel, before quietly slipping into dock in Ushuaia, where we will be free to disembark around 8.00 am. We then farewell the expedition team and transfer to the airport for our flight to Buenos Aires.

On arrival in Buenos Aires, we shall be met and transferred to our hotel, INTERSUR RECOLETA, or *similar*, for the next two nights. Dinner tonight will be at a local restaurant.

Buenos Aires is the Argentine Republic's capital city. Located on the southern bank of the River Plate, the population of greater Buenos Aires is around 13.5 million people and has been virtually rebuilt since the beginning of this century with very few of the old buildings remaining. The centre of Buenos Aires has maintained the original layout since foundation and the Plaza de Mayo is its heart.

Monday 2 March	Buenos Aires	(B D)
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This morning we will drive down Avenida 9 de Julio, the widest avenue in the world. We will pass the famous Colon Opera House, the Obelisk commemorating the first founding of the city in 1536 Plaza de Mayo (May Square). We will also see the surrounding buildings; Government House, the Metropolitan Cathedral with the Mausoleum of General San Martin, Argentina's greatest national hero and the Cabildo, the colonial town hall built in 1751. Then we will head to La Boca, the traditionally Italian district where the first Italian immigrants settled and visit the famous 'Caminito' street.

The tour continues to the Buenos Aires port area, past San Martin Square towards the residential district of Palermo Chico and Palermo Park with its jacaranda and palo borracho trees which flower in the spring and late summer. The ride continues to Recoleta elegant district to visit the Recoleta Cemetery where the famous are laid to rest (including Eva Peron). We will return to the hotel along the stylish Alvear Ave.

Tonight, we will get a taste of Argentina's local cuisine with an interactive Argentine Dining Experience at Café Tortoni, designed to give you an introduction to the best of Argentine cuisine and culture. This is NOT a cooking class, but a fun and unique experience, where you will meet and dine with people from all over the world.

An international team of guides are on hand to spoil you and take you through every step of this culinary journey: Master the art of correctly closing empanadas before sitting down to a meal of authentic Argentine cuisine, paired with four boutique wines. Finish by learning how to prepare 'maté' paired with alfajores. We will meet and eat with fellow foodie travellers from all over the world.





Tuesday 3 March

Buenos Aires – Iguazu Falls

(B D)

This morning, we will be collected from our hotel and transferred to the domestic airport for our flight to Puerto Iguazu. On arrival in Puerto Iguazu, we will be met and taken to our HOTEL LOI SUITES IGUAZU, *or similar* for a two-night stay. Our hotel is immersed within the Iryapú subtropical rainforest, located just minutes from Iguazú Falls, and the city of Puerto Iguazú.

Puerto Iguazu is where the Argentine, Paraguayan and Brazilian borders meet.

Iguazu Falls is the spectacular semicircular cascading waterfalls bordering the countries of Argentina and Brazil.

This afternoon we will embark on a private half day tour of the Brazilian side of Iguazu Falls.

Visiting the falls from the Brazilian side will give us a completely different perspective, as we will have a panoramic view of the entire falls.

*** Optional at extra cost *** For those with a sense of adventure, you can take an optional trip on the Macuco Safari boat, going upstream on the river, taking you extremely close to the falls.

Also, from this side of the falls you may also be able to take a helicopter flight over the falls (approx. US\$100 per person. Please note that this cannot be pre-booked and is weather dependent). This flight takes around 7 minutes and is worth every cent.

This evening dinner will be included.

Wednesday 4 March

Iguazu Falls

(B L)

After breakfast today we will enjoy a private tour of the Argentinian side of Iguazu Falls - snacks & water will be included on this tour. We will be walking along the many tracks of the river and observing the falls from platforms that bring you extremely close to the water.

'Iguasu' in the Indian Tupi Guarani language means large waters.

Appropriately, the Iguasu River flows east west for 808 miles and then drops suddenly and violently into a 262-foot abyss at the falls. Set amidst jungle, a visit to these falls will be an unforgettable experience.

From our hotel we will be transferred to the visitor's centre inside the Iguazu National Park. We will board a small train to travel from the visitor's centre to the beginning of the upper path, lower path and Devil's Throat.

Upper walk: a walk of 500 mts long lasting about 45 minutes seeing the two sisters, Bosseti, Adam and Eve, Bernabe Mendez, Mbiguá and San Martín falls.

Lower path: with a professional guide we will walk 1.3 km of footpaths lasting 1½ hrs. It's a different view from which you will see the falls from the middle but be warned that you may get a little wet!

Devil's throat: before walking these two paths, we will board the little train.

After driving 4 kms, we will reach Devils Throat Station that surrounds the upper part of the Iguazu River, from here you will walk along a bridge (walkway) that leads to the balcony of Devil's Throat for the most spectacular view.

This evening dinner will be at your leisure.



Thursday 5 March

Iguazu Falls –Buenos Aires

(B D)

Today we will start the journey home. We will be transferred from our hotel to the domestic airport for a flight back to Buenos Aires.

Once we arrive at the Aeroparque domestic airport in Buenos Aires, we will be transferred to our accommodation INTERSUR RECOLETA or *similar*.

This evening, we will enjoy dinner at a local restaurant.



Friday 6 March

Buenos Aires -- Santiago -- Melbourne

(B)

This morning, we will embark on a half day Tigre Tour with Delta Cruise before being transferred from the hotel to Ezeiza International Airport for our flight home.

Discover the charm of the Tigre Delta on this private half-day tour from Buenos Aires. We will cruise for an hour through scenic rivers and canals while learning about the unique island lifestyle via audio guide. We will explore Tigre's highlights, including the bustling Puerto de Frutos market, the riverside promenade along Victorica Avenue, and the elegant Tigre Art Museum. On the return drive, we will enjoy views of local landmarks like River Plate Stadium, University City, and the city's Metropolitan Airport. This tour offers a perfect blend of nature, culture, and local life.

Sunday 8 March

Melbourne

We shall arrive back in Melbourne in the morning having crossed the International Date Line and will be transferred back to Warragul.

The other-worldly landscape of the Antarctic Sound is also known as 'Iceberg Alley'. If sea ice conditions allow, venture east into the Weddell Sea, known for its impressive sea ice and large icebergs. Feel your pulse quicken as vast tabular icebergs pass close by. We aim to land on fossil-rich islands for exploration and to hear from our expert Expedition Specialists. Roam the shoreline near where Adélie, gentoo and chinstrap penguins waddle, and delight in their charismatic antics. Zodiac-cruise in search of seals, whales and their calves. 

LATE BOOKINGS

Higher deposit payments are required for late bookings. A guarantee of full payment is required at the time of booking for all bookings received within 4 weeks of departure.

PASSPORT and VISA

A valid passport is required for all international travel.

Force majeure includes, but is not limited to: acts of God, accident, riots, war, terrorist act, epidemic, pandemic, quarantine, outbreaks of infectious disease or any other public health crisis, civil commotion, breakdown of communication facilities, natural catastrophes and natural disasters (including but not limited to flooding, fire, earthquake, landslide), adverse weather conditions, high or low water levels; government directed travel restrictions or omissions, changes in laws or regulations, national strikes, explosion, generalised lack of availability of raw materials or energy, nuclear or other industrial accident causing environmental pollution or contamination; change in law, meaning, enactment, amendment (including repeal) in the law or administration of any law in Australia or any jurisdiction or territory relevant to the booking contract, which includes changes in statute, regulation, determination, by-law, declaration, licence and the common law as applicable from time to time.

For the avoidance of doubt, Force Majeure shall not include (a) financial distress nor inability of either party to make a profit or avoid a financial loss, (b) changes in market prices or conditions, or (c) a party's financial inability to perform its obligations hereunder. In the event that a Force Majeure is declared, the customer will be bound by the third-party supplier/s Terms and Conditions, if applicable.

LIMITATION OF LIABILITY:

Subject to Australian Consumer Law, Gippsland Travel does not accept any liability in contract, tort or otherwise for any injury, damage, loss, delay, additional expense or inconvenience caused by a third-party supplier/s over who we have no direct control. Gippsland Travel is not liable for Force Majeure or any other event which is beyond our control or which is not preventable by us.

TERMINATION OF BOOKING CONTRACT OR CHANGE OF TRAVEL ARRANGEMENTS DUE TO FORCE MAJEURE

If Gippsland Travel, in its reasonable opinion, considers that any Force Majeure event prevents Gippsland Travel (whether directly or through its employees, contractors, subcontractors and agents) from lawfully or safely providing any products or services subject of the booking contract with you, Gippsland Travel may immediately by written notice; (a) terminate the booking contract (in whole or part of); or (b) change your travel arrangements as reasonably practicable to ensure your safety and invoice for any additional costs. If you are eligible for a refund once a booking has been cancelled, the balance less any non-refundable amounts will be forwarded to you once received by Gippsland Travel from the third-party supplier/s.

Gippsland Travel is not responsible for any delays of refunds from the third-party supplier/s. Refunds from third party supplier/s can take in excess of 6 weeks. Refunds will be processed as per original form of payment.

Travel insurance policies may provide cover for cancellation fees subject to their terms and conditions.
