Discover the best of beautiful Japan, from vibrant metropolises to serene rural regions bursting with culture. Among many highlights, a chance to see Japanese Macaques, enjoy a private dinner with a geisha or maiko, walk along the Nakasendo trail and savour spectacular cuisine along the way.

Take part in a Japanese calligraphy lesson, learning all about the nation's three alphabets – kanji, hiragana and katakana – and trying your hand at writing your own characters under the guidance of an expert instructor.

Delight in a lunch and visit to Nadagiku Sake Brewery where you will see tools that were used until the late 1950's. For an authentic taste of Japan, sample Sake and learn about the brewing tradition that has been passed down through the generations.

Enjoy a Sarubobo-making experience. An amulet particularly common in Takayama and the nearby Hida region, Sarubobo are red dolls with no facial features. Learn how to make the dolls and perhaps find some good luck yourself.

Explore the Sanmachi Suji district in Takayama, a beautifully preserved area with traditional Edo-period wooden buildings. Wander the quiet old streets lined with craft shops, sake breweries, and historic merchant houses, sampling local tea and digging into local treats like wagyu sushi.

Sunday, 12 April**Gippsland – Melbourne Airport****(D)**

We depart Gippsland for an overnight stay at the Park Royal Airport Hotel which will include dinner.

Monday, 13 April**Arrival in Tokyo, Japan**

We will walk to the airport terminal for our flight to Tokyo. Upon arrival at Tokyo Narita International Airport, we will be transferred to our hotel for a three-night stay.

Accommodation: **Hotel Niwa Tokyo**, or similar, for 3 nights.

**Tuesday, 14 April****Tokyo****(B L D)**

We have a full day exploring Tokyo. Our first stop is the **Tsukiji Outer Market**. Once we have explored the market, we will be ready to enjoy an exciting lunch. A veteran chef will teach you a meticulous and authentic **sushi nigiri experience at Tukiji Tamazushi Harumi Street Branch**. This is a hands-on experience of making and tasting your own sushi, and enjoy grating real wasabi, watching a bamboo leaf cutting show and an omelette show right before your eyes, making for a fulfilling experience. At the end of the course, you will receive a 'Certificate of Completion'.

Following our lunch we will visit the **Tokyo Imperial Palace Eastern Garden**, a scenic and historically rich part of the Imperial Palace grounds in Tokyo. The Eastern Garden offers visitors a glimpse into Japan's imperial heritage and natural beauty.

Our next stop is the **Shibuya Meiji Shrine**. The Shinto shrine is dedicated to Emperor Meiji and Empress Shoken and is surrounded by a forested area offering tranquility in the heart of Shibuya.

To finish off a day of exploring Tokyo, we will head to **Shibuya Crossing**, also known as the Shibuya Scramble. This iconic pedestrian crossing is surrounded by neon lights and bustling with pedestrians from all directions, a symbol of modern Tokyo. It is one of the busiest pedestrian crossings in the world, famous for its bustling activity and surrounding shopping and entertainment districts. The famous Hachiko dog statue in front of the station is also a popular landmark here.

We return to our hotel and have dinner at a local restaurant within walking distance.

Accommodation: **Hotel Niwa Tokyo**, or similar.

Wednesday, 15 April

Tokyo

(B L D)



After breakfast, we will meet our guide for another full day touring. We will start our day with a visit to **Azabudai Hills, teamLab Borderless**. This digital art museum offers immersive, interactive installations and exhibits that blur the boundaries between art and technology.

For a cultural experience, we will witness a **Sumo demonstration**. We will see wrestlers perform the traditional sumo stance of Shiko and experience the practice of Suppari face-to-face. For lunch, we will enjoy tonkatsu, a typical Japanese home-style meal, and chanko-nabe soup, a traditional sumo dish.

In the afternoon we travel to **Asakusa**, a historically bustling entertainment district which continues to celebrate its heritage with festivals and cultural events and a lively central area. The neighborhood retains a traditional atmosphere with its narrow streets, traditional shops, and rickshaws. The area is also home to Senso-ji, Tokyo's oldest and most significant temple.

Tonight, dinner will be included.

Accommodation: **Hotel Niwa Tokyo, or similar.**



Thursday, 16 April

Tokyo – Hakone Kanagawa

(B L D)

Our drive today takes us to Kamakura, the ancient capital of Japan, where we visit the 750-year-old **Great Buddha of Kamakura**, a bronze statue of Amida Buddha, which stands on the grounds of Kotokuin Temple. With a height of 11.4 meters, it has long been the second tallest bronze Buddha statue in Japan, surpassed only by the statue in Nara's Todaiji Temple and some recent creations. We shall also take a short ride on a local train giving us a peek into the homes that closely line the track.

After our lunch at a local restaurant, we will enjoy a **Hakone Lake Ashi Cruise** in the Hakone region known for its scenic beauty and views of Mount Fuji. Lake Ashi, also known as Ashinoko, was formed in the caldera of Mount Hakone after the volcano's last eruption about 3,000 years ago.

We shall take the **Hakone Ropeway** offering stunning views of Owakudani and Mount Fuji, connecting Togendai and Sounzan stations. We will continue to our hotel where there will be time to freshen up before we dine at the hotel's restaurant.

Accommodation: **The Fujiya Hotel**, or similar, overnight.



Friday, 17 April

Kanagawa – Matsumoto Nagano

(B D)

We journey to Matsumoto, gateway to the Japanese Alps, with a stop at the **Itchiku Kubota Museum**. Kubota Itchiku was the artist who revived the lost art of Tsujigahana silk dyeing, used to decorate elaborate kimono during the Muromachi Period. Exhibited are several of the artist's kimono creations, depicting themes of nature, the cosmos and the seasons. Also on display are parts of his unfinished masterpiece "Symphony of Light", a huge work comprised of 80 kimono that together form of a picture of Mount Fuji.

After time for lunch, we shall also visit the famous **Matsumoto Castle** dating back to 1593, one of Japan's most beautiful and well-preserved castles, known for its distinctive black exterior and historical significance. We continue to our hotel where there will be time to relax before we take a short walk to a local restaurant for dinner.

Accommodation: **Onyado Nono Matsumoto**, or similar, for two nights

Saturday, 18 April

Matsumoto

(B L D)

Our sightseeing today includes **Jigokudani Yaen-Koen**, the only place in the world where wild snow monkeys bathe in hot springs. Here is a paradise on earth for monkeys to live in. The troops of wild Japanese macaque (they are popularly known as snow monkeys) have inhabited here naturally through the ages. The monkeys' presence can vary depending on the season and environmental conditions.

After lunch in Hotarutei, we head to the **Daio Wasabi Farm**, one of Japan's largest wasabi farms, featuring scenic waterways, walking paths, and fresh wasabi products.

Our final tour stop for the day is the **Japan Ukiyo-e (Ukiyoe) Museum**, a print maker's dream, holding the largest private collection of ukiyo-e (woodblock prints), paintings screens and old books in the world. The Sakai family has collected more than 100,000 pieces over several generations.

We return to the hotel with time to freshen up before we take a walk to a local restaurant for dinner.

Accommodation: **Onyado Nono Matsumoto**, or similar.



Sunday, 19 April **Matsumoto - Takayama** **(B D)**

Today we travel by coach through the ruggedly beautiful Alps to the quiet, isolated town of Takayama, where old traditions are untouched by the passage of time. We shall visit the famous **Takayama Festival Float Museum**. The splendid yatai elaborate floats used in the famous Takayama Festival are known for their colorful and intricate decorations, and embody skills handed down over generations, and it's easy to see why the Takayama Festival is considered one of the three finest in Japan.

We will have free time for lunch and to wander the streets and explore the shops of this very traditional village. Later in the afternoon we shall visit the **Hida Folk Village**, an open-air museum featuring traditional thatched roof houses and buildings from the Hida region, showcasing rural life in Japan. We will also have the opportunity to learn how to make a traditional Sarubobo doll.

After we check in to our hotel, we will have dinner in the restaurant.

Accommodation: **Hotel Associa Takayama Resort**, or similar, for two nights.

Monday, 20 April **Takayama** **(B D)**

This morning, we enjoy a drive through the mountainous Shokawa Valley to **Shirakawago Village**. Shirakawa-go is a historic village located in the Gifu Prefecture in central Japan, known for its traditional gasshō-zukuri farmhouses, some of which are over 250 years old.



We shall also visit **Wada House**, one of the most iconic traditional gasshō-zukuri houses. Shirakawa-go, along with the nearby Gokayama region, is recognized as a UNESCO World Heritage site, known for its unique thatched-roof houses that have been preserved for centuries.

We shall stop at the **Shiroyama Tenshukaku Observation Deck** where we can see a nostalgic Japanese landscape spread out below, with thatched gassho-style houses amidst forests and rice fields. Flanked by the "Tenbodai Souvenir Shop" and "Tenbodai Cafe," this will be the ideal stop for lunch and some retail therapy.

We arrive back at the hotel with time to freshen up before dinner.

Accommodation: **Hotel Associa Takayama Resort**, or similar.

Tuesday, 21 April **Takayama - Kyoto** **(B D)**

We leave the delightful village of Takayama and drive to Tsumago-juku where we will stretch our legs on the **Nakasendo Walk** from **Magome-Tsumago** Trail, an attractive walk along the old Nakasendo. The trail between Magome and Tsumago is a well-maintained section of the former Nakasendo, the route that ran along the Kiso Valley and connected Tokyo with Kyoto during the Edo Period.

There will be time for lunch before we drive to Nagoya Station to board the bullet train to Kyoto. On arrival we will be transferred to the hotel. Dinner tonight will be at the hotel.

Accommodation: **Hotel Okura Kyoto**, or similar for four nights.



Wednesday, 22 April **Kyoto** **(B L)**

We have a full day of touring with our first stop at the **Kinkaku-ji Temple**. The Golden Pavilion is covered in gold leaf and reflects on a pond surrounded by lush gardens; originally built in 1397 as a retirement villa for a shogun, Kinkaku-ji, the Temple today is considered one of Kyoto's most important locations.

Our next visit is to the **Arashiyama, Tenryu-ji Temple**, a UNESCO World Heritage Site featuring a beautiful landscape garden with a central pond; one of Kyoto's five great Zen temples founded in 1339.

For lunch we shall enjoy shojin ryori (Zen vegetarian cuisine) at **Shigetsu Shojin Ryori** a large temple-style restaurant surrounded by the natural beauty of Tenryu-ji's World Heritage gardens. Shojin ryori has its origins in Chinese Zen and was brought to Japan together with the Zen teachings during the thirteenth century. As natural parts of everyday life, cooking and eating have always been regarded in Zen as forms of spiritual practice.

Shojin ryori manifests this outlook in a cuisine that harmonizes with Buddhist ideals, creating satisfying, nourishing meals from fresh seasonal vegetables, herbs, and wild plants while depriving no animals of life that both sustains the body and provides a true taste of Zen.

On our way back to the hotel, we shall stop at **Arashiyama Bamboo Grove**, a serene bamboo forest with towering stalks creating a peaceful atmosphere; adjacent to temples and the famous **Togetsukyo Bridge**, offering scenic views of the Hozu River.

We return to the hotel and the rest of the evening is at your leisure.

Accommodation: **Hotel Okura Kyoto**, or similar.

Thursday, 23 April **Kyoto** **(B)**

Our drive this morning take us to Nara, where we will visit the Home to the Great Buddha statue, this temple is one of Japan's most famous and historically significant temples. The **Great Buddha of Nara** is officially called “Rushanabutsu,” or Rushanabutsu, and is about 15 meters high, or 18 meters including the pedestal. The Great Buddha is facing forward with his right hand. This means “do not be afraid,” and his left-hand means “I will grant people’s wishes”. Japan at that time was suffering from plague and disasters. The Daibutsu-sama represents Emperor Shomu’s kind prayer for relief from such suffering.

Before we have time for lunch, we will visit the **Nara Park**, famous for its free-roaming deer, which are considered sacred and are friendly to visitors. We also visit the **Kasuga Taisha**, a Shinto shrine known for its many lanterns, donated by worshipers, and its beautiful, forested surroundings.

We return to the hotel and the rest of the evening is at your leisure.

Accommodation: **Hotel Okura Kyoto**, or similar.



Friday, 24 April **Kyoto** **(B D)**

Our sightseeing this morning will feature many cultural experiences including a tea ceremony, we learn the significance of the kimono and see the art of calligraphy. There will be free time to explore the market and sample some of the local delicacies at your own pace.

In the afternoon we visit the historic streets of **Sannensaka** and **Ninenzaka**, lined with lined with traditional shops, cafes, and teahouses; preserved to reflect Kyoto's Edo-period charm and atmosphere. Tonight, we will enjoy an authentic private **Maiko dinner** at a traditional Japanese restaurant. During our dinner, you will watch a geiko or maiko (apprentice geiko) dance performance.

After the performance, we can talk to the geiko or maiko and ask questions. If there is time left, you can also play traditional games.

Accommodation: **Hotel Okura Kyoto**, or similar.



Saturday, 25 April

Kyoto - Kurashiki

(B L)

This morning, we transfer to the Kyoto station to board our bullet train to Himeji. On arrival we visit one of Japan's most iconic and best-preserved castles, known as the "White Heron Castle" due to its elegant appearance. **Himeji Castle** dates to 1333 and is the largest and most visited castle in Japan. It was registered in 1993 as one of the first UNESCO World Heritage Sites in the country

We shall enjoy lunch and a tour of **Nadagiku Sake Brewery**. During the tour of a few of the buildings, we will see tools that were used until the late 1950's. For an authentic taste of Japan, we can sample Sake and learn about the brewing tradition that has been passed down through the generations.

We reboard the bullet train to Okayama. On arrival we shall be met and will be transferred by coach to Kurashiki to our hotel. The rest of the evening is at your leisure.

Accommodation: **Kurashiki Royal Art Hotel**, or similar, for two nights.

Sunday, 26 April

Kurashiki

(B D)

This morning, we transfer to the Uno Port to board a ferry to **Naoshima Island**. Commonly known as Art Island, Naoshima Island is peppered with elegant galleries and outdoor art pieces. We visit **Chichu Art Museum**, a unique museum built into the hillside overlooking the coastline. Designed by Ando Tadao, the building lies mostly underground and relies only on natural light to illuminate each work.

The museum's permanent collection of Monet's famous Water Lilies comes to life in the adjacent Chichu Garden, where 200 kinds of flowers faithfully recreate the physical experience captured in Monet's works. Step inside the **Benesse House Museum**, which was also designed by Tadao.

Later, we visit the **Art House Project**, which features an abandoned temple and shrine, along with a collection of abandoned houses and workshops converted into art installations and galleries by artists and architects from across the world. A ferry will take us back to Uno and we join our coach to Kurashiki for dinner at a local restaurant.

Accommodation: **Kurashiki Royal Art Hotel**, or similar.

Monday, 27 April**Kurashiki - Hiroshima****(B L)**

We depart the hotel and shall walk along the canal to the **Bikan Historical Quarter**, a well preserved area with Edo-period buildings, picturesque canals, and traditional shops and museums.

On our way to Hiroshima, we shall stop in at the **Mazda Museum** which captures over 100 years of a unique history, from challenging and innovative technologies to award-winning design and next-gen engineering. We stop for lunch in Naoshima at a local okonomiyaki restaurant. The word "okonomiyaki" is derived from "okonomi" meaning "as you like" and "yaki" meaning "grilled". It's commonly referred to as being a Japanese pancake. We will arrive at our hotel in the afternoon and then the rest of the day is at your leisure.

Accommodation: **Sheraton Grand Hiroshima Hotel**, or similar, for two nights.

**Tuesday 28 April****Hiroshima****(B D)**

Our first stop today is the Hiroshima Peace Park to visit the **Peace Memorial Museum**, **Memorial Hall** and **Atomic Bomb Dome**, which memorialise and is a poignant reminder of the lives lost in the atomic bombing.

We continue our excursion to **Miyajima Island** where we will explore the island on foot, taking in its scenic beauty and unique atmosphere. **Senjokaku**, also known as the "Pavilion of a Thousand Tatami Mats". This large wooden hall located on Miyajimais was commissioned in 1587 by Toyotomi Hideyoshi, one of Japan's most powerful feudal lords and a prominent unifier of the country during the Sengoku period. However, Hideyoshi died before its completion, and the hall remains unfinished to this day. Originally intended to be a Buddhist library to house and study sacred texts, Senjokaku's construction was halted after Hideyoshi's death.

After some time for lunch, we will visit the **Itsukushima Shrine**, famous for its "floating" **Torii Gate** that appears to float on the water during high tide.

Dinner tonight is at a local restaurant, before we return to the hotel.

Accommodation: **Sheraton Grand Hiroshima Hotel**, or similar.



Wednesday, 29 April

Hiroshima - Osaka

(B D)

We leave Hiroshima today and walk to Hiroshima Station where we will board a bullet train to Osaka, a charming, relaxed city best known for its food, fun and nightlife—with some history and culture peeking through.

On arrival in Osaka, there will be some free time for lunch and to explore the **Dotonbori district** before we check in into our hotel. Dotonbori is located along the canal, a colorful district featuring an explosion of neon lights, mouthwatering street food, retro vibes, clubs, stores, and bars.

Tonight, we shall celebrate our experiences in Japan with a farewell dinner at local teppanyaki restaurant.

Accommodation: **Patina Osaka**, or similar, overnight.



Thursday, 30 April

Osaka - Australia

(B)

This morning there will be time for last minute shopping. After transferring to the airport, we shall depart Japan on our flight to Melbourne.

Friday, 1 May

Australia

We arrive back in Melbourne, and will be met and transferred by coach back to Gippsland.

LATE BOOKINGS

PASSPORT and VISA

Force majeure includes, but is not limited to: acts of God, accident, riots, war, terrorist act, epidemic, pandemic, quarantine, outbreaks of infectious disease or any other public health crisis, civil commotion, breakdown of communication facilities, natural catastrophes and natural disasters (including but not limited to flooding, fire, earthquake, landslide), adverse weather conditions, high or low water levels; government directed travel restrictions or omissions, changes in laws or regulations, national strikes, explosion, generalised lack of availability of raw materials or energy, nuclear or other industrial accident causing environmental pollution or contamination; change in law, meaning, enactment, amendment (including repeal) in the law or administration of any law in Australia or any jurisdiction or territory relevant to the booking contract, which includes changes in statute, regulation, determination, by-law, declaration, licence and the common law as applicable from time to time.

For the avoidance of doubt, Force Majeure shall not include (a) financial distress nor inability of either party to make a profit or avoid a financial loss, (b) changes in market prices or conditions, or (c) a party's financial inability to perform its obligations hereunder.

In the event that a Force Majeure is declared, the customer will be bound by the third-party supplier/s Terms and Conditions, if applicable.

If Gippsland Travel, in its reasonable opinion, considers that any Force Majeure event prevents Gippsland Travel (whether directly or through its employees, contractors, subcontractors and agents) from lawfully or safely providing any products or services subject of the booking contract with you, Gippsland Travel may immediately by written notice; (a) terminate the booking contract (in whole or part of); or (b) change your travel arrangements as reasonably practicable to ensure your safety and invoice for any additional costs.

If you are eligible for a refund once a booking has been cancelled, the balance less any non-refundable amounts will be forwarded to you once received by Gippsland Travel from the third-party supplier/s.
